### HIS WORD TODAY

### BAPTISM OF THE LORD

"I take it you know what has been reported all over Judea about Jesus of Nazareth, beginning in Galilee with the baptism John preached; of the way God anointed Him with the Holy Spirit and power. He went about doing good works and healing all who were in the grip of the devil, and God was with Him"... "You are my beloved Son. On you my favor rests."

Peter used a gathering in the home of Cornelius to give a profound talk and teaching. In a few short words he tells of Jesus' call, mission, His giftedness with the spirit and power or grace. Because of these attributes, He launched His mission of teaching, healing and doing good works. Rather than stating that He is the Son of God, Peter indicates that God accompanied Him.

The mission of Jesus has moved from Galilee to an entire world. Others have been chosen to continue His ministry. In this 'year of the priest' we acknowledge the unique role in continuing this same work of Jesus, most especially in providing the Eucharist. Yet the preaching, teaching, healing, all the good works are part of the life of our church and are the responsibility of all the baptized. When we observe the life of the church today providing education, health care, family support and all the corporal works of mercy, we discover the mission of Jesus at work among us.

As Peter described the life and times of Jesus, may we observe how this same mission continues today. May we see our role in continuing the work of Jesus, going about 'doing good works.'

## The Solemnity of Mary the Mother of God January 1

From all eternity, God chose the Virgin of Nazareth as the future Mother of His Son. Mary became the Mother of God at the Annunciation. Although Mary was chosen, she had the gift of free will, and it was because of her faith and trust in God that she said yes to the acceptance of Jesus in her womb.

The Church has taught from the earliest times that Mary is truly the Mother of God the (Theotokos). St. Paul observed that "God sent His Son, born of a woman," expressing the union of the humanity with the divine in Christ (Gal 4:4). Mary was the Mother of God in His human nature. This special role of Mary in salvation is clearly depicted in the Gospel in which she is seen constantly at her son's side.

Mary the Mother of God is the most exalted of all her titles and is the source of all of her other privileges.

On Calvary, Christ gave His Mother to all humanity as our spiritual Mother. May we pray always for her guidance throughout our life

This feast is celebrated each year on January 1st.

**Prayer:** Heavenly Father, through the fruitful virginity of Mary, You bestowed the blessings of eternal salvation on humankind. As we begin this New Year, grant that we may enjoy her intercession, for through her we received Your Son, our Lord and Savior. Amen.

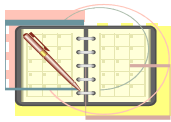

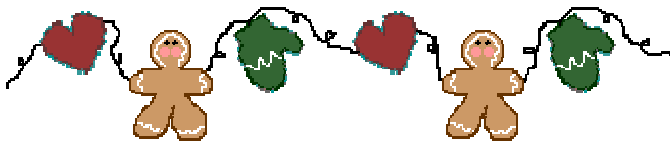
